The Aresti catalogue is print only, has no web nor pdf versions. That is not convenient.


About the catalogue itself, most pilots are happy with it even though we would benefit from some additional figures (e.g. free unknown linking figures), or make some changes in K.

Problem: Aresti family is not responsive to inquiries and takes no interest in participating in improvements, yet they possess the copyright on the catalogue and all derivatives.

Suggestion: keep trying to reach out to the family in written form, every year and on the name of CIVA. If they don't respond, after some years it might be considered as an abandonment of their rights (to be confirmed with an appropriate lawyer).

Proposal was made to send another written request to Aresti in the name of CIVA.

Freestyle catalogue

Daniel Genevey suggested the CC starts working on a freestyle catalogue. Even if Aresti has the right on any derivative, and this definitely would be one, there is no reason for not working on it just in case we find an agreement with the Aresti family.

The idea of working on some transcription of standard freestyle figures has not received proposals from the CC members. Contact with Olivier Masurel, who had his personal transcription of some figures, was unfortunately not made before his passing out.
